

Cenacle Member Roles

Members

1. Pursue and maintain a sacramental life
2. Follow guidelines and suggestions outlined in the Prayers and Practices section of the Manual
3. Through Sacraments of Mercy..... the Eucharist and Reconciliation, find spiritual guidance and strength for their spiritual journey

Facilitators

1. A lay person to guide the members through sharing and prayers at the cenacle meetings
2. Encourage an open climate for discussion/fellowship
3. Together grow in knowledge of Catholic teaching and the message of Mercy and make this a part of our daily life (Resources: Bible, CCC, Diary of St Faustina)
4. Develop/help/organize the members to stay in touch with the sick and dying

Spiritual Mentor (Msgr Weiss)

1. Support the ministry with prayer and encouragement
2. Discern on works of mercy, clarify any questions/concerns
3. Periodic meetings with Msgr Weiss to update on the progress

Suffering- Soul Members

1. Consciously and voluntarily offer up prayers and physical sufferings to God for accomplishing our mission
2. Do not have to attend meetings but are welcome
3. Their personal intentions are remembered by the cenacle during the prayers of petition

Members assisting in efforts to save souls (for sick and dying)

1. Adoration in the Chapel with Exposed Blessed Sacrament every Thursday from 3 to 4 pm (recite prayers including the Chaplet of Mercy, silent adoration). Prayers offered especially for priests who bring us the Sacraments.
2. Adoration in the Chapel with Exposed Blessed Sacrament every Friday, from 3 to 4 pm (recite prayers including the Chaplet of Mercy, silent adoration). Pray for the sick and the dying, especially for those in Newtown and at the Danbury Hospital
3. For those who cannot physically attend, we will provide the Litany of Reparation, Act of Spiritual Communion, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Divine Praises, etc via e-mail or hardcopies and these can be recited from anywhere
